Message from the Associate Alumnae of Douglass College Executive Director Valerie L. Anderson '81, MBA

The vital involvement and support of our alumnae and friends have helped us to move Forward Together for 95 years! Every time alumnae gather, there is a warmth. It comes from an undeniable bond we share that is rooted in our organization. That feeling is enhanced each time an alumna benefits from the support and expertise of another alumna. We were students for four years but are alumnae forever.

As an alumnae organization, we continue to examine ourselves and to determine how we can better serve you. This strategic analysis of the Associate Alumnae of Douglass College (AADC) served us during this year as we have transitioned to a new mission that is more alumnae focused. Please see our Strategic Planning update in this issue to learn more about the steps we have taken towards an ever stronger future.

As we share our annual report for the fiscal year 2016-2017 in this newsletter, it marks the first year of the AADC Board of Directors operating under the terms of the Agreement with Rutgers Parties. The Agreement was reached in July 2016, following a series of thoughtful and productive mediation and negotiation sessions. The past year's revenue and expense activity is a reflection of the transition that is taking place; however, the historic role of the AADC in the establishment and stewardship of the endowment (the Douglass Fund) to support the college and her students is still evident. It is with the utmost integrity that AADC leaders forge our path.

At the heart of what we do as an alumnae-created, alumnae-led, alumnae-driven and alumnae-supported organization is build relationships and provide opportunities for meaningful connections. It is to the credit of our Board of Directors and our Executive Committee, countless volunteer leaders of our AADC Regional Connection Groups, Affinity Networks and committees that the AADC remains relevant and vital to so many. We are better together. Because of your commitment, alumnae are connecting with the AADC and with each other.

As we continue our celebration of our milestone 95th anniversary, we are building momentum for our weekend festivities from April 19-21, that include Alumnae Reunion Weekend and the AADC Forward Together Gala: From Our Founding Into Our Future. We herald the Vanguard Class of 1968

marking its 50th Reunion and welcome milestone classes of years ending in threes and eights, together with all alumnae, guests and friends of the AADC. I hope you will mark your calendars and join us.

Our Women's Life-long Learning Initiative suite of educational programs is providing new opportunities, including the highly successful Victoria Dabrowski Schmidt '42 Workplace and Professional Development Symposium and the AADC Mabel's Alumnae Mentoring Program, each in its second year. The Symposium drew outstanding presenters and large numbers of alumnae and participation in Mentoring doubled over the first year. Our Symposium committee is also branching out by offering networking and job-seeking skill sessions throughout the year. Another part of the Initiative debuts February 24, with the first of our free "AADC Smart Talks," this one about genealogy, called "Find Your Roots."

Many of you already know the AADC Young Alumnae Network's annual Cabin Fever and Sweet Treat Competition takes place on February 3. This has become a time-honored tradition where alumnae take a break from winter and enjoy the camaraderie of spending an afternoon doing crafts, knitting and more. Our committees are hard at work. Notably, our AADC Memorabilia Committee is working behind the scenes to preserve our history.

I am so pleased to announce that the AADC will welcome Dr. Laura Micheletti Puaca '99, an associate professor in the History Department at Christopher Newport University in Newport News, VA, who returns to campus to deliver the Zagoren Lecture on March 6. She will speak about women's history in the STEM fields.

Our year of commemorating our 95th anniversary has another important event taking shape as the AADC Black Alumnae Network plans its second annual Sisters Conference on May 19. The conference will take an expanded name to memorialize the legacy of a beloved former dean, as it becomes the Jewel Plummer Cobb Sisters Conference.

It is truly my hope that you will take advantage of all the AADC offers alumnae. Come to events, programs or get involved in planning.

Thank you for being such a special part of our sisterhood. We look forward to finding new ways to engage, educate and empower each and every alumna. Remember, we are better together.

AADC Strategic Planning Initiative Update

Volunteers for Teams Welcome, Share Your Expertise

Many of the new programs and services that you have seen coming from the AADC are the direct result of the Strategic Planning Initiative, headed by Kathi Love '75. The group consists of four teams, each addressing a specific area of interest and need. The teams and the volunteers leading them, along with staff support, are:

Marketing and Communication – Tina B. Gordon '72, with staff support from Anne Marie Russo. The goal is to brand the AADC in all our communications and marketing materials consistently under the "Forward Together" banner. The team is especially interested in expanding its social media presence and invites new members with expertise in LinkedIn to join. The team is also expanding the use of technology to connect alumnae near and far.

Increase Participation outside the Tri-State area – Sharon Gant Yorlano '79, with staff support from Valerie Hughes Zieniuk '05. Many of the Regional Connection Groups are thriving, and the goal is to expand their offerings and to start new groups in other regions, providing mechanisms for alumnae to get together, network and participate in activities in their location.

Evaluate Alumnae Benefits – Lynn Bershak Koblin '78, with staff support from Eileen Cotter. The team is examining benefits and services to active and regular members. The group then intends to benchmark other nonprofits for examples of benefits provided to their constituents that may assist us in developing a plan for the AADC and to market test it with current donors.

Highlights from a Dynamic Year

The AADC's vitality as an organization serving alumnae with educational, inspirational and diverse events and programs was on display during fiscal year, **July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017**, through the enthusiastic participation across the generations. We began a special time in our history with the **Kickoff of the AADC's 95th Anniversary at our Founders Day Celebration and AADC Society of Excellence Induction Ceremony** in the spring on April 22.

It was a year of firsts as we unveiled the new **Women's Life-Long Learning Initiative**, a suite of educational opportunities for alumnae at every stage of life. Included is the **AADC Mabel's Alumnae Mentoring Program**, which paired some 70 alumnae Mentors and Mentees in its inaugural year of providing priceless connections. Also launched was the **Victoria Dabrowski Schmidt '42 Workplace and Professional Development Symposium**, titled, **"Bridging the Gap,"** which drew more than 250 registrants for invaluable workshops, sessions and networking on September 16. All of this is possible because of our dedicated committees.

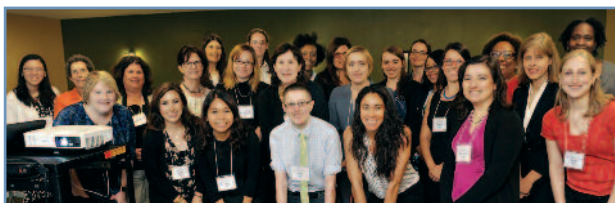
Alumnae responded to our lectures. On October 20, international journalist **Roxana Saberi delivered the 2016 L'Hommedieu Lecture, "Courage Under Fire,"** a riveting story about being a political prisoner in Tehran. The **Zagoren Lecture** on March 21, given by **Patricia Teffenhart '01**, Executive Director of

the New Jersey Coalition Against Sexual Assault (NJCSA), was an intriguing lecture about elevating public discourse on sexual violence and the advancement of women and girls.

Affinity Groups engaged alumnae. A powerful **AADC Black Alumnae Network Sisters Conference, "Telling Our Truth,"** was held on November 12. BAN also took a bus excursion to the National Museum of African-American History and Culture in Washington, D.C. **AADC Young Alumnae Network** hosted Sisterhood Book Clubs, a well-received wellness event, its annual **Cabin Fever** and **Sweet Treat Competition** and also teamed up with BAN for a Paint 'N Pour event.

Our **AADC Regional Connection Groups** are thriving and bringing alumnae together in a range of locations, including **North Carolina, New York City, New Jersey, Washington, D.C.** and in **Florida**. Groups planned and organized luncheons, sold-out trips to Broadway shows and museums, and provided a personal touch with gatherings and presentations hosted by alumnae leaders in their homes.

In June, at our treasured tradition of **Alumnae Reunion Weekend**, we celebrated all alumnae, particularly the Vanguard Class of 1967 on their 50th Reunion and the classes with the years ending in 2s and 7s. It included the Vanguard Fifty Society Induction Ceremony, Milestone Classes parade and the added presentation of the **AADC Alumnae Awards** at Reunion Convocation.

Since receiving an AADC Alumnae Fellowship last fiscal year, Melanie Plasencia '12, left, who is pursuing a doctorate at the University of California at Berkeley, has begun writing her dissertation, titled, "Rich by Other Means: How Older Latino Immigrants Age in Place in An Ethnic Enclave." She hopes to provide one of the first systematic studies of the aging Latino population in the United States.

Melanie is also participating in the AADC Mabel's Alumnae Mentoring Program as a Mentee. She felt an immediate connection to her Mentor, Sue Estler '66, a retired professor. "Sue is a fountain of information and I feel fortunate to remain part of the alumnae community in this way," says Melanie. "I am thankful for all of the generous support," she says, "because of alumnae before me, I have been able to experience many opportunities that have shaped my eventual path." Melanie will attend Virginia Tech's Future Faculty Development Program in January. She will then bring her expertise back to campus, where she will teach a class this spring, *Latinos & Migration*, in the Department of Latino & Hispanic Caribbean Studies at Rutgers.

Elizabeth Rodman Voorhees Society

Gifts of \$25,000+

A founding benefactor of the College, Mrs. Voorhees also bequeathed her estate for the purpose of constructing and endowing a Chapel and left specific instructions that the building include a fireplace and staircase for use in the annual Yule Log ceremony.

Neilson Family Society

Gifts of \$10,000 - \$24,999

Three generations of the Neilson Family served as benefactors; James Neilson was a notable benefactor and member of the Board of Managers when alma mater was founded. Mr. Neilson donated much of the land on which Douglass Campus is located.

Loree Society

Gifts of \$5,000 - \$9,999

Leonor F. Loree, a Rutgers University trustee, funded the construction of an Athletic Field on the Douglass Campus, and was asked to name the field. He called the field "Antilles" in memory of the first American transport to be sunk in World War I.

Cooper Society

Gifts of \$1,000 - \$4,999

Mr. and Mrs. Drury Cooper owned a home directly across the street from College Hall during alma mater's first year of operation. In 1919, the couple gifted the house to the College and Cooper Hall became the College's second building.

Jameson Young Alumnae Society

Gifts of \$300 - \$999 (Class Years 2008-2017)

A large part of the land for the Jameson Campus was acquired for the College through the generosity of a member of the Rutgers University Board of Trustees, Edwin C. Jameson. To honor Mr. Jameson's wife, it was named the Mary Gardner Jameson Campus.

2017 SOURCES OF REVENUE & SUPPORT

The Associate Alumnae of Douglass College and the Douglass Fund

JULY 1, 2016 – JUNE 30, 2017

On July 20, 2016, following a series of thoughtful and productive mediation and negotiation sessions and subsequent discussions, Rutgers University, the Rutgers University Foundation (RUF), the Associate Alumnae of Douglass College (AADC) and the Douglass Fund (DF) reached an Agreement regarding the fundraising responsibilities for Douglass Residential College (DRC) and the AADC. Nearly one year post settlement, the AADC has transitioned to a new role that is more alumnae focused. The past year's revenue and expense activity is a reflection of the transition that is taking place; however, the historic role of the AADC in building an endowment (the Douglass Fund) to support the College and her students is still evident.

Under the July 20, 2016 Agreement, the AADC may no longer solicit contributions to benefit Douglass Residential College or her students; however, in certain cases contributions for specific scholarships, gifts in progress and bequests that pre-date the Agreement may still be accepted. As such, the efforts of the AADC over the decades continue to benefit the Douglass Fund.

The AADC continues to be a self-supporting organization, and has refocused its fundraising efforts to alumnae initiatives, including alumnae fellowships for graduate study

Fiscal Year 2017 Revenue Received by the AADC and the Douglass Fund

Contributions to Endowment

AADC

Contributions to the unrestricted endowment for the AADC were less than 1% of all revenue received.

Douglass Fund

Contributions to the Douglass Fund endowment comprise 58% of all revenue received in FY17. These contributions may be unrestricted or they may be restricted to a certain purpose by the donor. Per the July 2016 Agreement among the AADC, the Douglass Fund and the Rutgers Parties, the AADC may no longer solicit contributions to the Douglass Fund; however, per the Agreement, in certain cases, contributions from specific scholarships, gifts in progress and bequests that pre-date the Agreement may still be accepted.

Non-endowed restricted contributions

AADC

Non-endowed restricted contributions may be expended, but only for the purpose for which the donor restricted the gift. In FY17, the AADC received contributions restricted for various alumnae initiatives that represent 1% of all revenue received.

Douglass Fund

In addition to outright contributions, accounting rules require certain expectancies to be reflected in this category. As a result, a bequest expectancy to the Douglass Fund of approximately \$800,000 from the trust of a deceased donor appears as a restricted contribution to the Douglass Fund, comprising 12% of all revenue received in FY17.

Investment Income

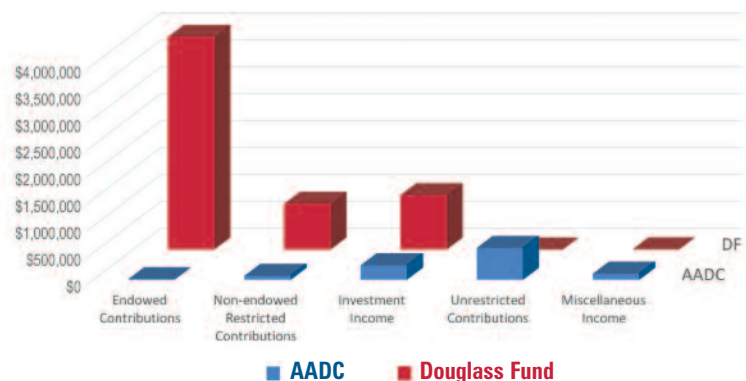
AADC

AADC Investment Income accounts for 4% of all revenue and is primarily generated by the endowment. Investment income is largely restricted based on endowment donor stipulations.

Douglass Fund

DF Investment Income accounts for 15% of all revenue and is solely generated by the endowment. As noted above investment income is largely restricted based on endowment donor stipulations.

Unrestricted Contributions

AADC

Unrestricted contributions to the AADC represent 9% of all revenue received in FY17. These contributions made it possible for the AADC to fulfill its mission to develop and promote the connections among Douglass alumnae by providing programs, services, networks and life-long-learning opportunities that represent the interests and needs of our diverse alumnae. The AADC provides prudent stewardship of the Douglass Fund and other endowed funds held by the AADC for the benefit of Douglass; distributions from these funds contribute financial support to Douglass and her students.

Miscellaneous Income

AADC

Miscellaneous Income received by the AADC from sources, such as GoodShop, AmazonSmile, Gift Assessment and the alumnae travel program, represents 1% of all revenue received in FY17. This income is unrestricted and assists the AADC in fulfilling its purpose.

All financial information is based on Forms 990.

FISCAL YEAR 2017 EXPENDITURES: WHAT IS INCLUDED?

Alumnae Relations

AADC expenditures represent 6% of all combined FY17 expenditures.

The AADC provides programs including Mabel's Alumnae Mentoring Program, Alumnae Reunion Weekend, the Victoria Dabrowski Schmidt '42 Workplace & Professional Development Symposium, Women's Life-long Learning Initiatives, visiting lecturers and more that provide opportunities for interaction among alumnae.

The AADC coordinates alumnae regional groups and affinity groups as another way for alumnae to connect with each other and the AADC.

During FY17, activities also included the kickoff of the AADC's 95th Anniversary Celebration in April 2017 and extensive planning that will culminate in a weekend celebration in FY18.

Additionally, the AADC continues awards programs to honor alumnae and other individuals for service to the AADC, and to honor alumnae for their distinguished careers. The AADC also actively participates in award programs of other organizations, frequently nominating alumnae to be honored.

Communications and Marketing

AADC expenditures represent 5% of all combined FY17 expenditures.

The "AADC Newsletter for Alumnae & Friends" was mailed to all alumnae as well as other contributors and friends. The AADC E-news electronic newsletter was also sent via e-mail each month.

The Associate Alumnae of Douglass College website that provides information on programs offered by the Associate Alumnae, individual class reunions, fellowships for alumnae, Class Notes, and much more was maintained. The AADC website also provides a mechanism for online event registration and for making a gift.

Alumnae were kept informed following the signing of the Agreement among Rutgers, RUF, AADC and the Douglass Fund by facilitating town hall meetings, publication of FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions) and maintenance of the latest information portal on the AADC website.

The AADC's "Forward Together" brand was launched and has been communicated in all print, web and social media platforms.

The AADC maintained a presence in social media on Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, YouTube and Instagram.

Development & Donor Relations

AADC expenditures represent 10% of all combined FY17 expenditures.

The AADC conducted fundraising from alumnae and friends in support of the mission of the Associate Alumnae of Douglass College.

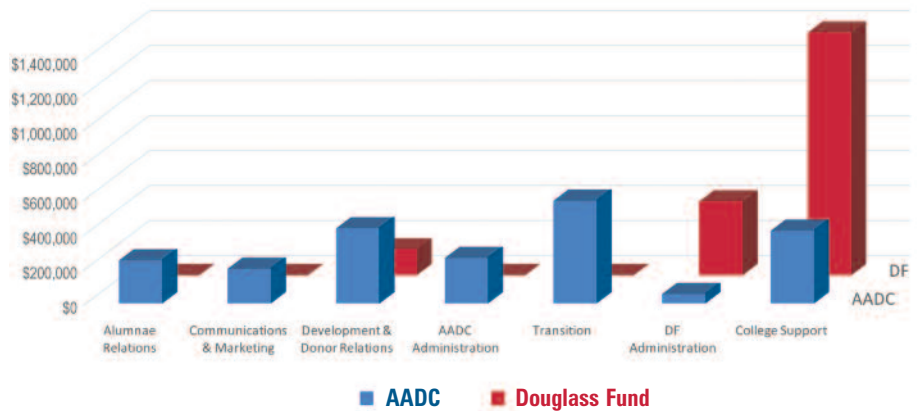
This included an annual giving program with phone, direct mail, email, social media, Giving Tuesday and crowdfunding components. The annual giving phone program includes a phone program consultant who runs the program with oversight from the AADC.

The AADC also has a planned giving program and a planned giving component of the AADC Web site.

The AADC cultivated and stewarded gifts to the AADC Annual Appeal, gifts designated for alumnae initiatives and for alumnae fellowships, and stewarded gifts to the Douglass Fund as well.

FY17 also included resolution of items placed on hold pending settlement outcome and residual capital campaign follow-up.

Administration

AADC expenditures for AADC administration were 6% of all combined FY17 expenditures.

AADC expenditures for DF administration were 1% of all combined FY17 expenditures.

DF expenditures for DF administration were 10% of all combined FY17 expenditures.

Expenses for the general administration of the Associate Alumnae of Douglass College and the Douglass Fund are reflected here.

AADC salaries and operating expenses are directly allocated (above in Alumnae Relations, Communications & Marketing and Development and Donor Relations) to the functions that they serve to the extent possible.

Investment management fees for endowments of the AADC and the Douglass Fund are included in these Administrative Expenditures.

Operation Restructuring

AADC expenditures represent 14% of all combined FY17 expenditures.

Due to the Settlement Agreement with the Rutgers Parties, the AADC incurred operation restructuring expenses including, but not limited to, the following: moving, storage and office transition expenses; write-off of investment in building improvements due to lost use of office space; professional services and sharing of staff severance expenses.

College Support

AADC expenditures were 10% of all combined FY17 expenditures.

DF expenditures were 34% of all combined FY17 expenditures.

The AADC provides prudent stewardship of the Douglass Fund and other endowed funds held by the AADC for the benefit of Douglass; distributions from these funds contribute financial support to Douglass and her students. In FY17, these distributions included:

Student support through established scholarships, study abroad funding, academic prizes, and special opportunity funding, as well as fellowships for graduating seniors, who will be alumnae when they receive their fellowship.

Support for programs such as the Global Village, the Douglass first-year course, Public Leadership Education Network and the Douglass Project for Rutgers Women in Math, Science and Engineering, is made possible by restricted and unrestricted endowment.

Unrestricted funding was used by DRC to support Douglass initiatives such as recruitment and traditional events like graduation convocation.
